
Anti-Capitalist Politics

Understand that equity takes long, sustained efforts; imagine long term solutions that can adapt over time.


Collective Access

> Focusing on users with more access needs only benefits more people, understanding that accessibility benefit everyone.










Empower the intended end users with the necessary background knowledge to understand and contribute to shared mobility data.








